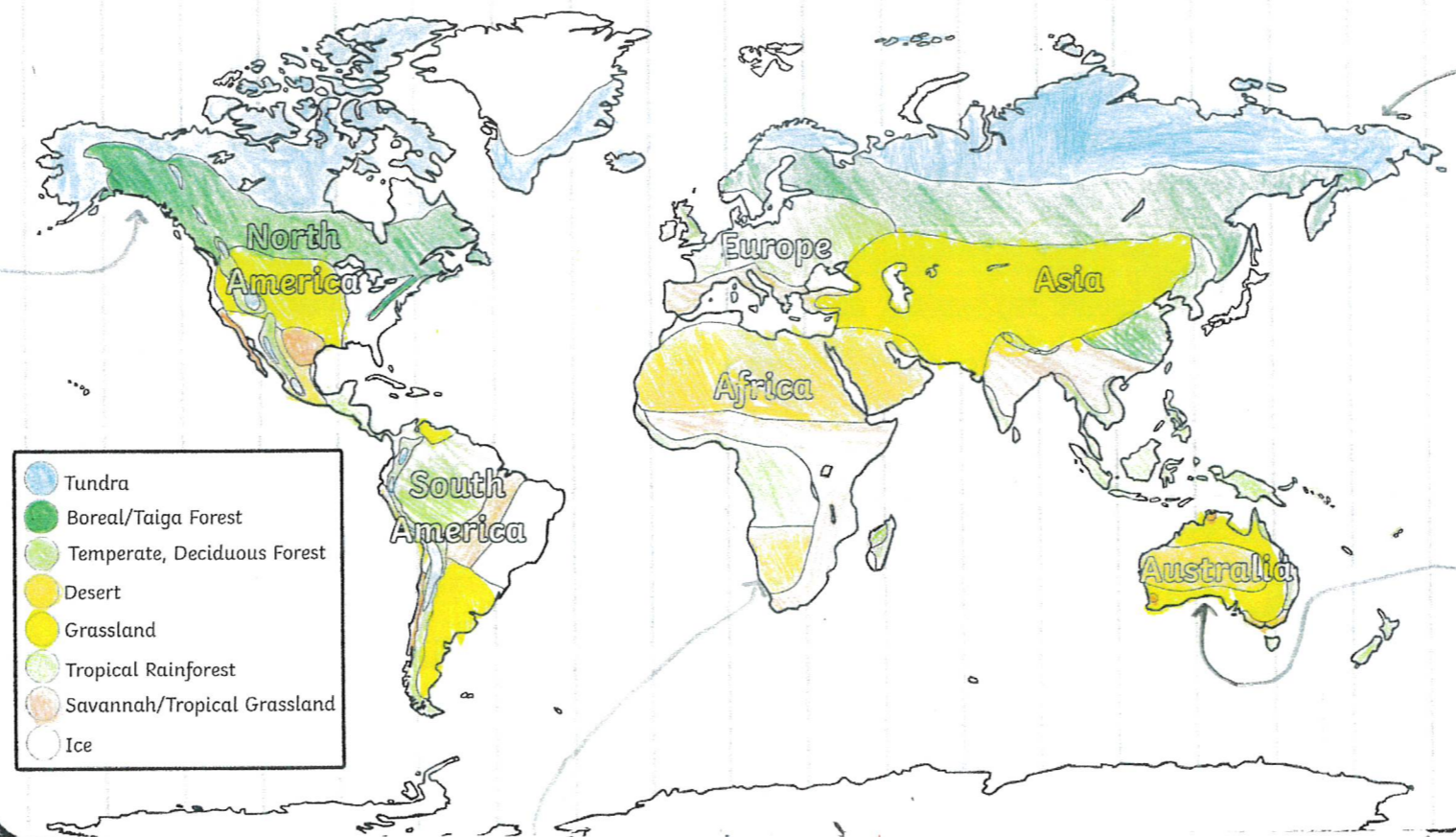
WALT understand what biomes are and locate biomes around the world
