NSPCC

This week, children in Years 1-6 have had assemblies on safeguarding from the 'Speak Out, Stay Safe' NSPCC programme. This programme helps children to understand and recognise abuse in all its forms and that it is never a child's fault. It explains that children have the right to feel safe. It also helps children to know where to go to get help and support and taught them the number for Child Line. It was very informative and was introduced by Ant and Dec, which really helped to engage the children. Next week, Years 2, 5 and 6 will have follow up workshops from NSPCC representatives who will be visiting our school.

The internet is a great resource for children, but it also comes with risks. To help children stay safe, please ensure you have parental controls set up on devices at home. It is important to limit screen time using device settings and to remind your child not to share their personal information online. Encourage them to speak to you if they find anything upsetting or worrying. We regularly remind the children about online safety at school so please help us by reinforcing this at home. If you need any support or advice, please speak to your child's class teacher.
