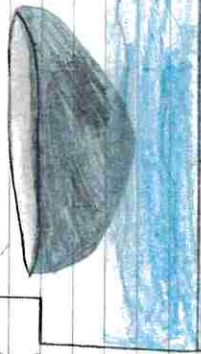
Yesterday, after a whole year, Shackleton and his courageous crew finally stepped foot in Chile, South America from their treacherous expedition.

On 14th August, the 27 men (including Shackleton) and the 64 dogs, plus the cat set

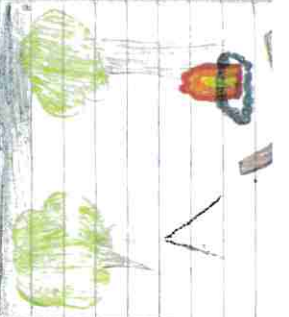
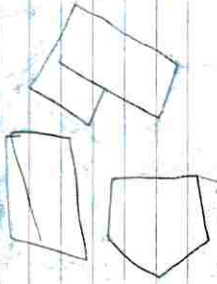
Sailing in a Buenos Aires, Argentina to prepare for a deadly, dangerous, treacherous adventure. In 9 in Antarctica a few miles out from the Antarctic coast.

The Endurance was wrecked by the packed ice. The crew built a camp and ate penguins and seals for all their lives.

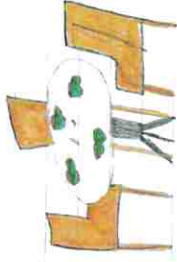
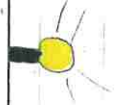

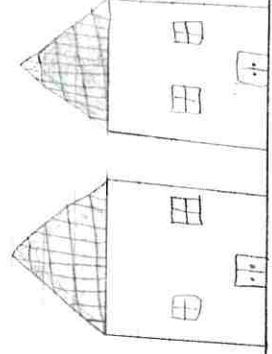

However, this was not the worst to happen. Shackleton had to kill all 64 dogs and the cat too. Shackleton, Ocean and Worsley sailed 500 miles on the dangerous waters to reach South Georgia, including 36 miles north of Chipping up and mountains were very ill from altitude sickness and frostbite. Luckily, all Shackleton, Ocean and Worsley survived and were in the Antarctic. They met the wonderful gentlemen named Mr. Scott. He made them some tea. "Well, my body was frozen as in ice cubes. I couldn't see my own eyes!" Mr. Scott sneezed. He let them borrow the James Caird to rescue the 20 men in the Antarctic. When all the 27 men (including Shackleton)
