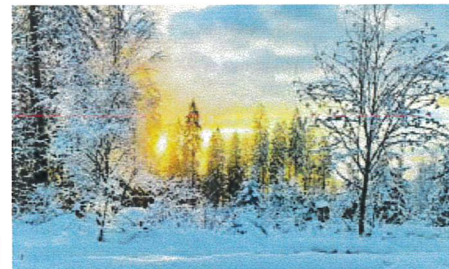




Newsletter

As we all know, reading is a key life skill and a priority at Riverside. The Reception and Key Stage One children engage in daily reading as part of their Read, Write Inc lessons and all year groups have regular comprehension and reading activities in class to support their understand of the text and to develop their comprehension skills. We also encourage reading for pleasure and have many opportunities for this in school, including during lunchtime. The books that the children look at in class have been carefully chosen to support their reading and writing skills at the right level. It is really important that children continue to read frequently at home to develop their skills. This can be using both their school scheme book and a book for pleasure, and of course children can always read other books, magazines and so on as well. Even when children become more confident readers, it is still important that they read regularly at home. If you need any advice or support with reading, please speak to your child's class teacher.

Next week, we welcome back Miss Tullett, one of our Assistant Headteachers, from maternity leave. She will be in school Tuesday—Friday and will continue to lead English in the school, including Read, Write Inc. 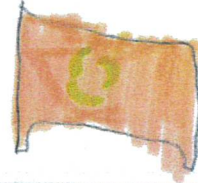

Recycling is important by making something new with something recyclable.



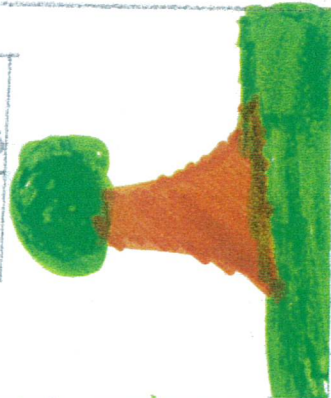
Natural Resources
