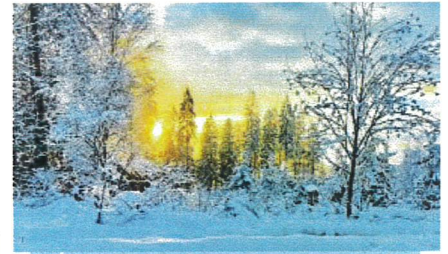

Dear Parents/Carers,

Online Safety

This week's newsletter focuses on online safety. As we continue to integrate technology into our children's learning experiences, it's important to ensure that they are navigating the digital world safely and responsibly.

Here are some key points to discuss with your child to help them stay safe online:

Privacy Matters – Teach your child **not** to share personal information such as their full name, address, or school details online. Remind them that not everyone on the internet can be trusted.

Safe Communication – Encourage open communication with your child about who they are talking to online. They should only interact with people they know in real life, and always tell you if something feels uncomfortable.

Recognising Risks – Help your child understand that not everything online is true, and some things they may encounter (such as messages or pop-up ads) may be misleading or harmful.

Respecting Others – Reinforce the importance of being respectful, kind, and responsible when interacting with others online. Cyberbullying can have serious consequences.

Time Management – Encourage a healthy balance of screen time. Too much time spent online can affect sleep, physical activity, and face-to-face interactions with family and friends.

As always, we encourage parents to stay engaged with their child's online activities. Regularly checking in with your child about their digital experiences will help them make good choices and stay safe. We will continue to support children in school with online safety lessons and together, we can ensure that our children enjoy the benefits of technology while staying safe and secure. Please speak to us if you have any questions or want any advice.
