They went outside to investigate the footprint, sharing their ideas and asking lots of interesting questions about how it got there and who it might belong to. The children were inspired by their discovery and wrote their own newspaper reports, showing great creativity and curiosity.

We also enjoyed a wonderful class assembly from Kestrels class, who shared their learning on The Tudors. We met Tudor kings and queens, learned many fascinating facts, and were introduced to Henry VIII's six wives. The singing and acting were fantastic, and the children should be very proud of their performance.

Today, our Year 4 children took part in a Lego challenge where they designed and built a house using specific criteria. They showed great teamwork, creativity and perseverance, and clearly enjoyed the challenge.

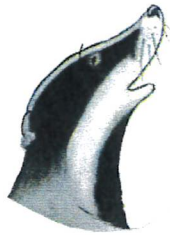

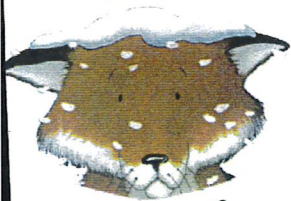
